ZEALANA LUXURIA SERIES BLENDED CASHMERE & BRUSHTAIL POSSUM DOWN

TWISTED CABLE SCARF

MATERIALS:

- AIR chunky weight by Zealana 1¾oz/50g skeins, each approx 159y/146m (cashmere/ silk/brushtail possum)
- 2 skeins of #LO6 Silver (A)
- 1 skein of #LO4 Royal (B)
- US size 8 (5mm) needles
- Stitch markers

SIZES:

One size fits all.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS: NOTE: This is an oversized fit. 9" Width 58" Length

GAUGE:

9 sts of Twisted Cable Pattern = 2" and 8 Rows of 1 Twisted Cable Pattern repeat = 2" using US 8 needles.

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SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS 6-st RC- SI 3 sts to cn and hold to back, k3, k3 from cn 6-st LC- SI 3 sts to cn and hold to front, k3, k3 from cn

PATTERN STITCHES Twisted Cable Pattern (worked over 9 sts). Rows 1 & 5 (RS): Knit Row 2 (and all WS Rows): Purl Row 3: 6-st RC, k3. Row 7: K3, 6-st LC Row 8: Purl Repeat Rows 1-8.

PATTERN

Using A and US 8 and CO 43 sts. NOTE: Slip the first and knit the last stitch of every row (edge stitch). Rows 1 & 3 (WS): Purl Row 2: Knit Row 4: Purl Row 5 & 7: Purl Row 6: Knit Row 8: Fold the edge towards the back at the Purl Ridge and knit each stitch together with a corresponding stitch from the CO Row (border is formed).

Then set up for pattern as follows: NOTE: Reel 3 separate bobbins for Col B.

Row 1 (WS): With A- Sl1, k1, p1, (k3, work 9 sts of the Twisted Cable pattern as follows: with A- k3, with B-k3, with A- k3) 3 times, with A- k3, p1, k2.

Row 2 (RS): With A- Sl1, p1, k1, (p3, work 9 sts of the Twisted Cable pattern as follows: with A- p3, with B-p3, with A- p3) 3 times, with A- p3, k1, p1, k1.

NOTES

Col B position will stay the same throughout the pattern- but will be weaving through the cable as it gets braided.

Repeat last 2 Rows- moving Col B as needed till scarf measures 50" (or till desired length).

Change to just using A- and on the next WS Row- start working the border as follows:

Rows 1 & 3 (WS): Purl Row 2: Knit Row 4: Purl Row 5 & 7: Purl Rows 6 & 8: Knit

Cut yarn leaving a long tail. Use that tail to graft the edge to the back of work. Weave in the ends. Block.
